

SERMON NOTES 3/14/26



God invites into union with Him. In doing this, we are in union with the One who tames all chaos and confusion, therefore we become partakers in the taming of all untamable things in our lives because God is with us.

1. In **Job 41**, God speaks of leviathan, a creature that represents the chaos and destruction of things, a creature of the sea. We see in **Genesis 1** and **Rev 21** that the sea represents chaos and disorder and in the restoration of all things, there will be no sea; chaos and confusion. God is the One who tames all chaos and confusion in your life.
2. Leviathan means “twisting one”. A spirit of leviathan is a demonic stronghold of manipulation and twisting the truth, and leviathan can only be tamed by God. Without union with God, we are not strong enough to be free of manipulation, twisting, and chaos. Religious practice disconnects us from God and replaces God with practice; this is why many of the biblical truths are being twisted today. When we begin to walk in union with God, we begin to rightly divide truth from error and all twisted ideas become untwisted.
3. In the same way Leviathan is described, so is Satan. Chaos and disorder are evidences of Satan’s work. Where there is chaos and disorder, there is evidence of something not being submitted to the Lord. God’s order is light, and to be in union with light is to bring order to all chaos; chaos defined as operating apart from intended divine design.
4. We see in **Job 41:12-17**, that leviathan’s strength is seen in his makeup of scales being tightly sealed together. This is the key to strength, to be interlocked and interconnected with God and others that are submitted to God – union with God and His church. **Romans 8:29** shows us we have a pre-design to be like Jesus; this is the best version of you. When we are union with His image, we walk in our best day; this is being identified securely in the Lord.
5. As the passage continues, God revealed the reason Job survived all the loss and heartache in his life, that if Job was alone he would have been destroyed, but the fact that he was still there was evidence that h was never alone, God was with him and we need to embrace that truth, that we are too weak to survive anything, the only way we do is that God never leaves or nor forsakes us (**Hebrews 13:5**).
6. Job repents in **Job 42:1-6**, from all the things he spoke over himself, for all the doubt, for challenging God, and he begins to see God face to face. As we read in **1 Corinthians 13:11-12**, there is a day God invites us to see in perfect clarity, and this day is not far off, it is a revelation of face to face union with God every day of our lives!
